Since joining the Board of Directors of the Animal Welfare League of Alexandria in 1993, Gordon has served in various capacities, including as the League's President, its Treasurer, and the Chair of the Long Term Planning Committee. Before joining the Board, Gordon was a volunteer, primarily at special events.

Gordon is employed as an Assistant United States Attorney in the Eastern District of Virginia, where he has been a criminal prosecutor since 1991. He was fortunate to have the opportunity to contribute to the prosecution of Michael Vick in 2008 for dogfighting, and the arrangements to care for the seized dogs. He also is a Lieutenant Colonel reservist in the United States Army's Judge Advocate General's Corps. Gordon was a contributor to *Fund-raising for Animal Care Organizations*, published by the Humane Society Press in 2005, edited by Julie Miller Downing. The book offers detailed advice for nonprofit humane societies, animal shelters, wildlife rehabilitation centers, and other animal-care organizations seeking to expand their universe of supporters, and is a step-by-step guide to success in planned giving, direct mail, capital campaigns, special events, major gifts, and grants.
